# AN IMPORTANT MESSAGE TO ALL BAULKHAM HILLS CAPTAINS, PLAYERS, COACHES, MANAGERS AND SUPPORTERS

## Code of Conduct

Following on from an incident involving one of our teams, which was referred to the PDCA Disputes Committee, I would like to remind all senior captains & vice captains and junior managers & coaches of their responsibilities.

There is an expected code of behaviour set out in the PDCA Rules & Fixtures book (P1). Baulkham Hills Cricket Club also has a "Code of Conduct", which is available on the website. We expect that all officials, players & spectators will abide by these rules. As a captain or coach, you have a responsibility to ensure your team complies with the Laws of Cricket & that the game is played in the "Spirit of the Game". The PDCA do not look favourably on officials who neglect their responsibility and may implement penalties. Please ensure that you ensure your team complies with these responsibilities.

## PDCA Special Meeting

Due to an increase in poor player behaviour this season, the PDCA called a special meeting of all club Presidents & Secretaries on Thursday December 8. The result of the meeting is that PDCA is having a crack down on player behaviour. In summary the main points are:

- 1.** A "Zero Tolerance" policy has been implemented for the use of foul language that is audible from outside the playing field. Official umpires have been instructed to report all players who infringe. Players who are reported will be referred to PDCA for further action, which may include suspension. Player umpires are also asked to report all instances that occur. The association is in danger of losing grounds because of repeated complaints from residents near grounds.
- 2.** Dissent - all forms of dissent toward umpires (official or player umpires) is unacceptable and will be reported. Indicating that you do not agree with the umpire's decision (batsmen, bowlers or fieldsmen) is considered dissent. All batsmen are reminded that it is a player's responsibility to leave the wicket immediately once being given out by the umpire. Again player umpires are asked to report players who offend.
- 3.** Player behaviour. On the field it is the Captain's (not the Umpire's) responsibility to control the behaviour of his players. Please enforce this.
- 4.** There is also a crackdown on cricket uniforms - in particularly shoes and hats. The player uniform section of the rule books states:
  - 22.1.** All players appearing in a competition match must wear proper cricketing attire, white or cream shirt with collar, white or cream trousers or shorts, predominantly white shoes or boots, white or cream cardigan or jumper, white socks. Shirts may contain strips in club colours on the collar and sleeve cuffs. The maximum width shall be 2 cms in total with a limit of 1 cm per stripe.
  - 22.2.** Players in Grades A to B4 inclusive must wear long white or cream trousers. This Rule shall not apply to boys who are also participating in Junior Competition matches. Such boys shall be permitted to wear white or cream shorts.
  - 22.5.** If a wristband or headband is to be used it must be white.
  - 22.6.** Where head covering is worn, it shall be a cricketing cap, helmet or white hat.
  - 22.7.** The above Rules will not apply in the case of a substitute fielder. When the substitute fielder is not the aforementioned cricket attire, the placing of this fielder in the field should be in a position behind the wicket.
  - 22.8.** No player shall be allowed to play if wearing other than proper cricket uniform, except as provided in Rule 22.7

Baulkham Hills Cricket Club has a variety of caps for sale that are appropriate to wear when playing These are available for purchase at the Ted Horwood & Charles McLaughlin canteens

PDCA, through the Umpires Association, intends to rotate some official umpires through those grades that usually do not have them (B3 & below). It is expected that umpires will enforce the above issues - so be prepared. With a limited number of official umpires, it may be that you will not see a black & white. Remember that a player umpire has the same powers as a black & white. They are deemed to be official umpires. This policy will not have any effect on player umpires, so please ensure you meet your responsibilities to umpire when you have a bye.

Player umpires are also expected to comply with dress codes and these are in the PDCA rulebook. Rule 52. 5 states “It is expected that player umpires are dressed appropriately, with the following assumed to be the minimum: White shirt with a collar, dark trousers or shorts, white socks and white shoes or boots”.

The committee trusts that all players will take note of the above.

Should you wish to discuss anything in relation to the above matters, especially umpiring matters, please call me on the numbers below.
