A special mention goes to Jason Luther who chose not to bowl this game in favour of tackling the wicket keeping duties. Jason kept wicket very well indeed and saved many a sundry with some quick footwork and several diving saves, particularly down the leg side. Well done indeed.

At the end of 31 overs Pendle Hill were 6 for 62, which was a gettable score provided we batted sensibly. All in all the bowling effort was very good with all bowlers unlucky not to get extra wickets. On the down side though, our wides and no-balls tally reached 18 in just 31 overs, which is simply too high and consistently higher than most other teams in our competition. I'm sure all bowlers would have loved to bowl more overs this game but with just 31 to bowl and 10 bowlers to keep happy everyone was restricted to just 2 to 4 overs each.
