This was a game where the ball dominated the bat for the most part. Baulko won the toss and elected to bat but lost wickets at regular intervals to be all out for 132. Once again there were a number of useful contributions but nobody going on to make the big score needed to post a large total. Simon Ruxton continued his good season with the bat with 32, Saj Howpage made 24, and 20 each to Jack Farrell and Mitchell Webb. However, a top class bowling and fielding effort saw Baulko reduce Greystanes to 7 for 47 by stumps on day 1.
