200 Club Fundraiser

This season we are running a 200 Club raffle as a fundraiser. There are 20 weekly draws and the cost per ticket is \$40.

How it works

- Tickets are \$40 each, but when you break that down to 20 draws it's \$2 per week with a chance to win a minimum of \$80, plus you have 1 ticket of only 200 that is drawn each week.

[Sir Donald George Bradman](#) must surely be the greatest batsman of all time. In his last test innings at the Oval in 1948 he needed 4 runs to end with an average of 100. He was bowled by Eric Hollies for a duck. His test average of 99.94 and first-class average of 95.14 are both world records. His 974 runs in a single test series is also a record. He scored two triple centuries and 12 double centuries in test cricket and was once left stranded on 299*.

Our batting generally showed promise in defence, but against an opposition that bowled very well, we struggled to find the gaps and put runs on the board. Whilst some nice shots were played, they were usually straight to the fielders. Daniel and Oscar played the straight balls well and Sahil batted steadily for 6, while top scorer was debutant Haider with a solid 12 runs.

The key area for us to focus on in the field is minimising wides and no balls, as 76 of their 116 runs came from bowling extras.

When batting, calling for runs and then running hard between wickets, will be important to make sure we can get maximum value for our shots.

For a team with very little cricket experience, it was a fine first effort. I have already seen lots of progress from many of the boys just in the few weeks we have been training, and I know they will continue to improve with every week. Well done team.
