Service to Sport Medal – Terry Webb

Congratulations to Terry Webb, Life Member and long-time Equipment Officer.

Terry was presented with a Service to Sport Medal at the annual Bankstown Sports Club Sports Awards Dinner held at Bankstown Sports Club on Monday, October 24.



Terry joined Baulkham Hills Cricket Club as a player in the 1964/1965 season and played continuously until the 1988/89 season. Terry also played hockey for the club for more than 20 years.

Terry was coaching junior teams for six years before his children were old enough to start playing. He then coached his son Matthew's team from Under 10 through to Under 16, and his daughter Kate in the Under 18 Girls team that Baulkham Hills had for three seasons. When Matthew finished his junior cricket, Terry took on another junior team and coached them from Under 11 through to Under 16. Terry also ran the club's Coaching Clinic for four seasons from 1996/97 to 1999/00.

Terry also had a long association with Parramatta Womens Cricket Club where he served as Club President for several years.

Terry served as Honorary Treasurer for ten seasons from 1974/1975 to 1983/1984 and was Equipment Purchasing Officer 1987 to 1994. He has also served as a member of numerous Equipment and Practice Committees.

Terry took on the role of Equipment Officer in 2000/2001 and continues in this position in 2016/2017.

Terry was awarded Life Membership of Baulkham Hills Cricket Club in 1985. He was also presented with a 50 Years of Service award at our 2016 Presentation Dinner.

Our opponent had scored 416 runs last week so our captain, David Banks, did the right thing by winning the toss so we could bat first. For the second time this season, Ian Renton (24 runs) and Peter Touzel (17 runs) got to the first drinks break without loss. The opening partnership put on 51 runs and survived a challenging spell by former Baulkham Hills premiership winning bowler, Rod Fletcher. Once this partnership was broken, the run rate increased thanks partly to a brilliant short innings of 28 runs from Jonathan Barnitt. However, we lost four wickets in the second session. At 4/125, we were not looking so good, especially as we were one batsman short and David Banks was due at a family function in the city around the time stumps were to be drawn. Dinesh Bhardwaj was batting beautifully, with a slice of luck thrown in, but he needed support at the other end. He got it through Harrison Hall (26 runs) and Dev Moodley (27 not out). These three batsmen added 173 runs for the loss of just one wicket until Dinesh was finally out bowled for 122 runs in the 69th over. The Islip brothers then ensured we got to 300. In those two partnerships, David Banks waited to bat but in the end he was happy to leave and let the youngsters put us in a strong position.

After missing out on a bat last week due to a trip to USA, Sean Hampstead (3-52) flew in about three hours before the start of play and was ready to lead the attack but it was Lachlan Weekley (4-48) who took the vital opening wicket of B11's leading runscore by clean bowling him with a fast outswinger. It was some time before we were to experience any more joy and at 1/158, we were in desperate need of a wicket. Fortunately, Michael Islip (3-24) filled in again for us and he took the vital second wicket and two more wickets to leave us in a good position with Kings Langley at 4/165. Michaels' departure from the attack then saw the score race to 4/231 and King's Langley still had more than 20 overs left. David Banks then brought our opening bowlers back and Kings Langley's late order was no match for Sean and Lachlan who engineered a collapse of 6/21.

The B11s continue to improve and each week, more players are making contributions. Thanks again to Michael Islip for filling in from the 15/1s. He is comfortably leading the bowling averages for our team with an average of 6.4.
